## Association Dues & Coupon Books

The 2023 Budget Packet will be mailed to all homeowners no later than November 30, 2022. This packet will contain information regarding the change in dues effective January 1, 2023. Coupon books will also be arriving before January 1, 2023. You do not need to pay with the coupon – just list your account number on the check payable to Whitney Oaks Community Association. If you use bill pay service through your bank or have your account set up for automatic withdraw it is important ensure that the payment amount is updated to reflect the correct dues assessment for 2023. ***Please note that dues are due on the first of each month and is considered late if not received by the fifteenth of the month.*** It is highly recommended that payments are made prior to the first of each month to avoid accruing any late fees. If you are making a request for Saturday or Sunday, please ensure that the request is received before close of business on Friday. For longer-term requests, please be sure to complete a parking variance request form at <https://whitneyoaks.org/documents/>. Please be sure to follow the instructions on the form and submit photos with your request. ***Parking variances will not be permitted for boats, trucks, vans, house trailers, campers, recreation vehicles or other vehicles containing living quarters. Vehicles such as these may be parked temporarily in a driveway or in a street in front of the owner's lot for a period of not more than twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period for the purposes of loading and unloading.*** ■



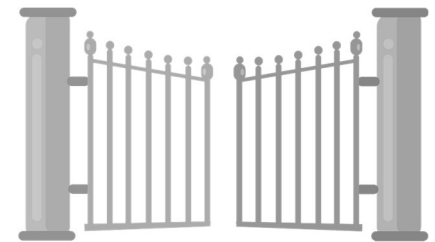
## Blue Knight Community Patrol

## Whitney Oaks Wildlife Notes

Meet the **Towhees!** We have two species of towhees in Whitney Oaks, the **California Towhee**, and the **Spotted Towhee**. Both species are about the size of a robin, so they are quite easy to see when present. However, there are some distinct differences in their appearances. The California towhee is brownish overall with a ting of orange under the base of the tail (see photo below) whereas the spotted towhee is very colorful with a solid black head and cape, black back and wings spotted with white, rust-colored flanks and white belly (see photo below). Both species have relatively long tails. Personally, I think the spotted towhee is one of the most attractive birds found in Whitney Oaks.

California towhees are seen year-round here. We have observed them in our backyard every year since we moved here 22 years ago. Most of the time they are seen on or near the ground foraging for insects and seeds. It's rare to see them very high in trees. Spotted towhees appear to be winter residents here, at least that's the only time I have seen them. Like the California towhees, they are most often seen on or near the ground close to shrubs or thick cover. Spotted towhees seem most active on cloudy, damp, or rainy days whereas I have not noticed that the weather affects the activity of California towhees. Listen for their sharp high-pitched "chips".

California towhees are attracted to bird feeders and appear less shy than spotted towhees. I have never seen a spotted towhee at my bird feeder, but they will readily go for seeds spread out on the ground under a low-hanging tree or near bushes. Their shyness has made it difficult for me to get a good close-up photo of one. Maybe I will get lucky this winter.
