## Rockridge Communities Units 39 & 44

- All requests for common area repairs or services, including landscape services provided by Bianco Landscape Management, must be submitted through Management. Homeowners shall not contact vendors directly that are contracted with the Association.
- Common area spaces surrounding homes are not to be used as storage of any kind; including ladders, garbage cans, bikes and any other play equipment.
- All trees, shrubs, plants, etc. located in the common area surrounding homes are owned and maintained by the Whitney Oaks Community Association. To avoid enforcement action and/or reimbursement costs, please do not remove any existing landscaping or plant materials in those areas. ■

Please be reminded that short-term parking variance requests can be made via management. Please also note that the management office hours of operation are from 9am – 4pm Monday through Friday. If you are making a request for Saturday or Sunday, please ensure that the request is received before close of business on Friday. For longer-term requests, please be sure to complete a parking variance request form at <https://whitneyoaks.org/documents/>. Please be sure to follow the instructions on the form and submit photos with your request. Parking variances will not be permitted for boats, trucks, vans, house trailers, campers, recreation vehicles or other vehicles containing living quarters. Vehicles such as these may be parked temporarily in a driveway or in a street in front of the owner's lot for a period of not more than twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period for the purposes of loading and unloading. ■

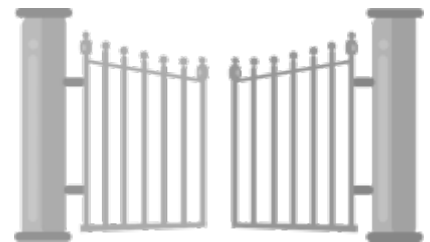

## Whitney Oaks Wildlife Notes

The **White-breasted Nuthatch** is one of the more commonly observed birds in Whitney Oaks. It is typically seen creeping up and down tree trunks and large branches probing for tiny insects. It is seldom seen on bushes or on the ground.

Both male and female sport black caps, white underparts, and blue-gray backs (see photos below). I think they look quite stylish.

Nuthatches typically nest in tree cavities. I have occasionally seen them going in and out of our bluebird nest boxes in the winter and spring, but none has ever nested in one. I think the more aggressive and territorial bluebirds see to that. One pair did nest and raise young in an unoccupied bluebird box at the Maidu Museum and Historical Site in Roseville where I was a docent recently. The female lays five to nine eggs and incubates them for two weeks. The male feeds the female while she is incubating. Both parents feed the young in the nest for about 3-4 weeks after hatching and for about 2 weeks after fledging (leaving the nest).

The nuthatch diet is primarily insects. However, they readily eat seeds in the winter months or when insects are not available. Bird feeders are particularly attractive to them at this time. A friend recently gave me a softball-size birdseed ball (seeds held together with lard) which I hung in a tree outside our bedroom window. I expected a number of bird species to partake of this offering. To my surprise, the only birds that fed on the seeds were our resident nuthatches (see photo). They eventually devoured the whole thing!!
